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 ready for the question? The question arises on Mr.
Sayre's motion that this section be drafted to include
a provision that if there is a two-house Legislature,
the number in the Senate should not exceed 43, and the
number in the House 150, under any circumstance, and that
if there is a one-house Legislature, the total number of
delegates not exceed 150.

MR. MILES: Mr. Chairman, just to make clear my own feeling about it, what I am really objecting to is anything in the Constitution which would ever permit any county not to have any representation in the General Assembly. I think that would be an especially unfortunate thing.

MR. SAYRE: If it were necessary, for instance, with a limit and we had a proviso that no county could be denied representation, this does not prevent, therefore, redemarcation of county lines accordingly. I would rather have it by that route where we have to realign to gain representatives than to have an open end as to the numbers.

THE CHAIRMAN: It would be like the tail wagging the dog, wouldn't it?
