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DR. BARD: The answer is Yes.

DR. BURDETTE: What would you think of calling this ratio the representative ratio? This is language that I am familiar with. You are not talking about the number of delegates to the population, but you are talking about the number of people that it takes to elect a delegate.

DR. BARD: That is correct.

DR. BURDETTE: As to the population. In our business, Harry, political science, it is called representative ratio, but it may not be a legal term.

DR. BARD: I don't think it would be understood as well. However, I would like to say this, that what we are talking about may be purely academic until we get the concept itself passed because at the last occasion, the Commission adopted the position that the new Constitution should provide merely the district should be as nearly equal in population as practicable.

After further consideration of this question, the Committee again recommends that the new Constitution contain a precise figure limiting the amount of the
