The other alternative is to leave it open and say as we said before, that based on population, so far as practicable, and again the litigation would arise because what is practical for one court or one man is not practical for another, and I think the time has come to write in to our own State Constitution a certain standard, even though we perhaps at this point can't fill in the percentage points.
