DR BURDETTE:

I intend myself to vote against

the idea of putting the ratio in the Constitution, because I would rather settle down, even if it takes a decade or five decades, to discover what is/acceptable ratio under the system of the Federal court, and I think the alternative would be that if the ratio were different from one that we put into the Constitution, for myself I think we ought to move to amend our Constitution to get that ratio. We can't determine what ultimately the courts will permit as a flexible ratio. I confess, in order to be fully fair about it, that I am not at all sold on the importance of a close ratio because I think that the factor of the people's acquaintance with their representatives is not to be blinked at; that is, political life so centers around the legal processes of a community that people even who have a good bit to do with public affairs come to know those who work with them and if they are in another county, they don't meet in
