civic organizations, et cetera, to the same degree that they
do within their own counties, and so I put some weight on
that, and therefore would like to have the ratio moved,
the disparity in the ratio moved upward as much as would
be constitutional, but it seems to me this is a Federal
interpretation, and therefore I don't want to jump in
this direction.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Mr.

Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: There is a real philosophical point here that I think is being overlooked. If we permit the counties to control how the State is to be set up under our State Constitution, we are permitting the Federal Government to make inroads to every county, town, function and so forth so that by another twenty-five years the State will be a hollow shell, a department of the Federal Government, and unless we buttress the strength of the State, what we are saying about the counties is going to be absolutely pointless, and this is the whole point that I am directing here by strengthening the State government, setting limits, providing powers
