I think that the point here is that we ought to have the principle embodied in our Constitution on a ratio.

JUDGE ADKINS: Mr. Chairman, at the risk of belaboring this point, I must make another comment because it seems to me that no question has come before this Commission yet which is as significant to my section of the State as this one.
