what the Supreme Court is going to do, are the ones who have stated, But we don't want the Supreme Court to run the affairs of the State of Maryland, and as a matter of fact, not to set forth some limitation and like Mr. Scanlan would think, that we might well leave that blank, we are dealing at the present with the question of whether there ought to be some standard, but not to set any standard would create the very thing that you are talking about.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me clarify one thing by a question, Dr. Bard: Am I correct in my recollection that the Committee never at any time had drafted language to include the proposition indicated by Mr. Smith, namely, that the population should be as nearly equal as practicable, but that was the alternate considered to the inclusion of the specified percentage?

DR. BARD: That is correct, though I should remind you that the alternate position was taken, in answer to Mr. Miles' question, by single vote last time.
