the group feels otherwise, that in voting on this principle we are voting between the two ideas, one of including in the Constitution a variation interms of a percentage, and the other of including in the Constitution a general provision that the legislative district should be as nearly equal in population as may be practicable.

DR. BARD: That is correct.

THE CHAIRMAN: We are not considering having no provision at all.

MR. SMITH: As determined by the Legislature?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, you just said what I wanted to say before I had a chance to say it. I think that the argument here, the discussion has gone off on the wrong tack. The argument by those who favor the specific limit has been that those of us who are opposed to it are sometimes in favor of unequal representation and that is not our position. Our position is that what equality is, is going to have to be developed over the years. We cannot, or we don't know, frankly, whether the Supreme Court is going to accept ten per cent variation,
