2 represent each house district.

3 Under this section, although the General  
4 Assembly is given the power to determine whether there  
5 will be single-member districts or multiple-member dis-  
6 tricts, the top limitation is fixed of no more than six  
7 delegates from any one house district, and of no more  
8 than two senators from any one senatorial district.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Dr. Bard, may I ask a question  
10 before we get into discussion? The phrase, One, but  
11 not more than two, seems to me to be inconsistency in  
12 itself. Does this mean at least one, but not more than  
13 two?

14 DR. BARD: At least one.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: Would it be better to say it
