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there are some legislative districts that run as high as eight. Wouldn't that be right, Mr. Scanlan? There are Fight delegates?

> MR. SCANLIN: Seven.

In Baltimore City, there is one DR. BARD: that has eight. We felt that eight would be too many, and in general we used the standard that is currently in operation.

I question whether even the current MR. SAYRE: standard is good from the viewpoint of a short enough That is all I am questioning. In my own: figuring out, it seemed to me that five was about as high as you could go and still be reasonably well informed as far as the general public is concerned, and I wondered if you might reconsider at least reducing the number in the House for any one district, down to five.

DR. BARD: I don't want to go through what we did last night in connection with percentages. We might settle for five and a half, but seriously, we believe that this would require, if we had single-member districts, some of us believed this at any rate, up and down the
