2 it effective at the time of the next General Assembly. I
3 am speaking personally.

4 " THE CHAIRMAN: When are the census figures
5 available?

6 DR. BARD: I met with a group that was ex-
7 ploratory in terms of the 1970 census, as far as Baltimore
8 City was concerned, and they said that they were going to
9 get them out more rapidly than ever before. He talked,
10 just the implication was that it would come out toward the
11 end of 1970. If this were to be so, then you would still
12 have until 1972, and that wouldn't be bad, because elec-
13 tion wouldn't take place until 1974. Even if they weren't
14 out until 1971, all of this has been speeded up by data
15 processing.

16 DR. BURDETTE: After the election of 1982, you
17 have got a problem.

18 MR. SCANLAN: Why do you have a problem in 1982?

19 DR. BURDETTE: Because if 1974 you have the
20 Legislature elected, it would be 1982, and since you won't
21 get these figures --
