

1 that. We had the unofficial figures in late '60.

2 DR. BURDETTE: You can't go on unofficial
3 figures.

4 MR. SCANLAN: We had official figures in the
5 spring of '61. I know with data processing, it is in-
6 conceivable they won't be getting it out much more quickly
7 than in the past.

8 DR. BURDETTE: I hope you are right. I would
9 still presume we don't want to put this off to the elec-
10 tion of 1988, for the 1980 period, for the reapportion-
11 ment of redistricting the Legislature.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Would it? If your figures were
13 available in the first two months of 1981, what would
14 be the difference?

15 DR. BURDETTE: I was really speaking to
16 Mr. Haile's suggestion. That would throw it, a two-year
17 one would mean the Legislature would have to redistrict
18 by 1983, say January 1, '83, but that is after the elec-
19 tion of '82. That is my point. I don't feel strongly
20 about it. I agree with your point, but I am trying to
21 make it practical. That is all.
