2 Mr. MILES: The executive would have some
3 control. He would have the right of veto, would he not,
4 on any plan that is produced and isn't that all that
5 would be necessary?

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Any other comment?

7 MR. SAYRE: Could I make one?

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre?

9 MR. SAYRE: I am not trying to give the governor
10 something that the Legislature also may not ought to have,
11 but setting up under the Constitution something that is
12 above both bodies as to how reapportionment should be
13 done, and when you toss it back into the Legislature, which
14 by its very nature will consume a lot of time that might
15 be better done to other types of bills, it just seems to
16 me that if you have something that more or less automatic-
17 ally works for the reapprtionment, it takes the onus of
18 the Legislature of having to work out some political
19 arrangement.
