MR. CASE: I wouldn't think so. 1 DR. BARD: Because they have acted in good 2 faith in terms of the law, it seems to me. 3 JUDGE ADKINS: Could you answer by saying 4 during a specified time or such longer time as the Court 5 of Appeals shall direct? 6 DR. WINSLOW: In the original statement? 7 JUDGE ADKINS: In the constitutional 8 9 provision. DR. BARD: I wonder if you need it. You don't 10 need it now the way it is operated. 11 THE CHAIRMAN: Would I understand that every-12 body would feel that if the plan, if the period is one 13 year and the General Assembly acts, and then it subsequent-14 ly after the year period is held to be invalid, everyone 15 would feel that it would come back, and you would start 16 the cycle over again with the General Assembly? Leave 17 the language to the Committee, if that is the feeling on 18 19 the principle. MR. MARTINEAU: Not with the same time limita-20

tion. I think it would be up to the court to determine
