2 THE CHAIRMAN: But that is a matter of language.
3 I want to get the principle. Everybody does feel that
4 if the Legislature adopts a plan and the plan is held
5 invalid, you come back to the Legislature and start the
6 cycle again. Does anybody object to that?

7 MR. HOFF: You go through the court processes
8 any number of times and delay this thing forever.

9 MR. CASE: I agree with that.

10 MR. HOFF: I think the language of the section
11 that we have just adopted would take care of the matter,
12 because if an invalid plan has been promulgated, and
13 the courts have thrown it out, then there has been no plan
14 within the eighteen months' period, and any petitioners
15 could request the Court of Appeals to promulgate its plan.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Then, Mr. Hoff would disagree
17 with the other views expressed that the court would still
18 have the power to extend it?

19 MR. HOFF: Yes.
