3 is, of course, the obvious. It is at the very heart of  
4 the recommendations of the legislative committee, and it  
5 is a very important decision, perhaps the most important

9 tory of this Commission, needing a strong Executive, a  
10 strong Legislature, respecting the authority and the

13 the Legislature this recommendation is now being taken  
14 away. You boys have had a field day this morning, so as  
15 a layman, let me ask, have we not been talking about three  
16 levels of approach to this problem? One is the Executive,  
17 well, no, one is the Legislature first. This was the  
18 original thought. Secondly, the governor, and then the  
19 courts.
