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ready for the question?

MR. MILES: Is this Mr. Sayre's motion?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. A voice Aye on the motion

is a vote in favor of taking away from the Legislature and the governor and the Court of Appeals the power to

redistrict and conferring that upon a Commission. Are you

ready for the question?

MR. HOFF: In the first instance only.

THE CHAIRMAN: In every instance.

DR. BURDETTE: Not every.

MR. HOFF: How else are you going to do it?

THE CHAIRMAN: I rule that the principle of the motion of Mr. Sayre is that redistricting be accomplished initially and finally by a commission to be created as provided in his motion, without reference to either the Legislature or the Executive, or the Judicial Branch, except to the extent that the Judicial Branch always has the right to have the litigation.

MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, I thought it was the governor acting upon the Commission's recommendation.

It is a little bit different than saying the Commission.
