2 MR. CASE: Well, thinking in the context of
3 trying to perhaps reach some sort of a compromise here,
4 my idea is that the law should require, the Constitution
5 should require the wrapping up of the plan within a
6 period of time, happily sufficiently ahead of the next
7 general election so that it will apply to that general
8 election.

9 An alternative to this might be a program like
10 this: That the principle that a valid plan or a plan has
11 to be adopted within a certain period of time.

12 MR. MILES: By whom?

13 MR. CASE: Wait a minute. You are a little
14 too fast for me, Clarence. You always have been. Then,
15 might it not be possible to say that the governor shall
16 immediately convene the General Assembly, or shortly
17 thereafter the publication of the figures, and at that
18 time submit to them a plan which may have been devised
19 in any way, through a commission or any way that he sees
20 fit -- let's say, by a commission -- so that it is hope-
21 fully a good plan, and then provide that if that plan has
