9 plan becomes effective.

10 MR. SAYRE: That is a good compromise.

12 substitute?

13 THE CHAIRMAN: That would meet the difficulty  
14 that we were talking about earlier about the timetable.

15 MR. CASE: Yes.

18 has projected here. I think a reapportionment problem
