

1 proposes with respect to a plan put before the Legislature
2 by the governor or by a commission of the governor is
3 almost identical as some of you must know what happens
4 at the national level, where Congress finally decided
5 that it was part of wisdom to let somebody else propose
6 a plan, so that now after each decennial census, the
7 Bureau of the Census has the job to reapportionment and
8 submitting a plan to the Congress which then can dispose
9 of it as they see fit. If they accept it, fine. If
10 they don't like it, they change it to suit their own
11 ideas, and thus the whole preliminaries of getting a plan
12 is taken care of more or less automatically by an exist-
13 ing agency of the government, but in this case would be
14 by a commission.

15 MR. CLAGETT: There would be no reason why the
16 government couldn't go ahead and have the Bureau of the
17 Census do some spadework for him and then he take the
18 responsibility.

19 DR. WINSLOW: I wouldn't know whether the
20 governor can get that from the Bureau of the Census. It
