2 JUDGE ADKINS: I have one question as to de-
3 tail. If Mr. Case's plan were adopted, would it be
4 envisaged that amendments by the Legislature to the plan
5 would be subject to gubernatorial veto, or would their
6 amendments be kind of sui juris so there would be no veto?
7 The reason I raise the question is, it seems to me if their
8 amendments are subject to veto, then the submission to
9 the Legislature could in many instances become a complete
10 nullity because all he would have to do would be to veto
11 their amendments and at the same time promulgate his own
12 plan.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Except they could pass it over
14 his veto. I assume Mr. Case that your plan meant passage
15 by law, which would, of course, be subject to veto.

16 MR. CASE: That is right.

17 JUDGE ADKINS: It would be subject to veto.

18 MR. CASE: All the legislative process.

19 DR. WINSLOW: But not item veto.

20 JUDGE ADKINS: In other words, he would have to
21 veto the whole plan.
