

1 DR. WINSLOW: Yes.

2 DR. BURDETTE: They would be out of session
3 before the veto would get in.

4 MR. CASE: We could provide for that.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion?

6 MR. SCANLAN: Would the Chair restate it? The
7 long coffee recess has dulled my memory.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: As I understand the plan, it
9 would provide that within a stated time, which we are not
10 now considering, after the census figures are available,
11 the governor would call into session the Legislature and
12 present to it a plan for redistricting. The Legislature
13 could act on that plan by disregarding it completely,
14 adopting it in part, or adopting it completely, whatever
15 they choose.

16 If the Legislature did not adopt the plan, or
17 if any plan adopted by the Legislature were subsequently
18 held invalid, then the plan originally proposed by the
19 governor would become law.

20 MR. BOND: With appropriate time limits?

21 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.
