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DR. WINSLOW: Yes.

DR. BURDETTE: They would be out of session

before the veto would get in.

We could provide for that.

Any further discussion? THE CHAIRMAN:

Would the Chair restate it? RCANLAN:

long coffee recess has dulled my memory. THE CHAIRMAN: As I understand the plan. it

would provide that within a stated time, which we are not now considering, after the census figures are available,

the governor would call into session the Legislature and present to it a plan for redistricting. The Legislature could act on that plan by disregarding it completely,

adopting it in part, or adopting it completely, whatever they choose.

If the Legislature did not adopt the plan, or if any plan adopted by the Legislature were subsequently held invalid, then the plan originally proposed by the governor would become law.

MR. BOND: With appropriate time limits?

THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.
