

1 THE CHAIRMAN: I don't think the motion before
2 you covers that point. I think we had better leave this
3 separate. Any further discussion?

4 DR. BARD: One thing I would like to say, Mr.
5 Chairman, is that I think Mr. Case has captured in excel-
6 lent language some of the problems that our Committee
7 tried to deal with, and I like it for a number of reasons;
8 among them would be the fact that it keeps this matter of
9 division of power of the three branches of the govern-
10 ment inherent within the idea, and at the same time takes
11 care of our concern, which was to make certain that
12 something was done within the allotted time.
