THE CHAIRMAN: This was discussed very fully at 1 the last meeting, and one of the alternates considered to 2 the staggered term idea, and I think the heavy prepon-3 derance of the Commission was against it. MR. MARTINEAU: Mr. Chairman, just a question, 5 a technical question about serving for the term four 6 years from the date of election. I am not sure as a matter 7 of law, is it always true that there is an implied, or 8 until their successors are elected so you wouldn't have 9 a situation where for a week or so you may not have any 10 members of the General Assembly in office? The election 11 may be four years and a week after the preceding election. 12 The usual language is until their suc-. 13 I don't know. cessors are elected and qualified. Maybe that is not 14 15 necessary. I don't know. JUDGE ADKINS: Don't they really serve four 16

JUDGE ADKINS: Don't they really serve four years from the date they assume office, not the date elected.
