MR. DELLA: This has become a practice more than a legal point of view, possibly, but the legislators, I understand, have been paid on a quarterly basis, and because they get a check through the end of December, they have been staying in office until December. They get sworn in in the session in January. I think this has been the practice of the old representatives staying in office until the first session of the new Assembly. Is this right, Governor?

GOVERNOR LANE: I don't recall how they were paid and the timing for which they were paid, because it was the least of my concern at the time, until I took office. I know it was the old Legislature that elected me when Governor O'Conor resigned, and then because of the election results, I was resworn in by the official inauguration under the election. It took place when we first met with the new Legislature -- no, the second one. The first one, I was elected by the old Legislature and the second one, by the new one.

THE CHAIRMAN: Dick, I notice that Section 2 was amended in 1956. Do you happen to know whether it had
