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THE CHAIRMAN: The rules adopted by one Legislature are not binding on another. If it is a continuous body, they could be. I think this is the kind of thing the Committee is thinking of.

DR. BARD: That is right.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Miles?

MR. MILES: Mr. Chairman, just to provoke discussion, I move it is the sense of the Commission that there be a fixed number of days for every regular session of the Legislature, whether that be three or four months, and of course, the governor having the right to call special sessions as he pleases.

MR. CASE: I will second this.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any disucssion? Mr. Bond?

MR. BOND: I would like to ask Dr. Winslow,

what section of Article 3 sets the 70-day session now?

DR. WINSLOW: You misunderstood me, the present Constitution sets a 70-day session.

MR. BOND: I am asking you whereabouts in the present Constitution?

DR. WINSLOW: I am sorry.
