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caliber of representation, and with not a very good reputation for forward-looking legislation.

I just feel from some limited experience in the Legislature that it should definitely be limited, because if you don't have a timetable, and you don't have a schedule of definite dates by which things are to be accomplished, it is going to be chaos. I also feel that this cuts across not only the Legislative Committee, it cuts across the Executive Department and the fine subcommittees of this Commission. As far as the Executive goes, how do we set up, I mean how does the governor in relationship with

speak to this, but how are you going to have a budget adopted by the State if you don't have a safeguard? You can debate the budget for twelve months.

the Legislature, as far as finance, I am sure you can

THE CHAIRMAN: That doesn't necessarily follow, Mr. Bond. You have a provision now that the budget must be acted on within a certain time. I don't think what you say necessarily follows.

MR. BOND: I am not the budget expert. I do feel you would find difficulties. The effective date of
