

1 the bill: Now we have a rule now that a bill usually
2 becomes effective on the first of July --

3 THE CHAIRMAN: June first.

4 MR. BOND: What are we going to do, have a
5 lot of effective dates throughout the year? How in the
6 world can the State govern itself and the State Departments
7 if every time the Legislature passes another bill, with
8 another effective date, they have got to reconstruct,
9 reconstitute or reshuffle the departments. For orderly
10 State government I think we have to have a limited number
11 of days for the Legislature.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Freedlander?

13 MRS. FREEDLANDER: Where this continuing body
14 exists, the appropriation for the salary for the legis-
15 lators has been a restrictive force because they will not
16 stay in session at the same rate for one year as they
17 would be three months or four months, and they cannot
18 appropriate any given four-year span; they cannot increase
19 their appropriation for salary, so I think this would
20 be a restrictive force in this.
