Now, with respect to the merits of the situation, and I just wanted to say that it hadn't been hodgepodge or carelessly done; it is a matter of evolution,
but I think to me, it would be unthinkable to have the
Legislature sitting as a continuous body for any number
of reasons but the principal wones are that in the first
place, regardless of how you want to look at it, the
Legislature in session is an upsetting process. That is
to say, it is a process which requires the close attention
of all segments of the economy, of labor, of business,
of everybody. It seems to me that the State can only
stand just so much of that, and then after that, it ought
to have a little vacation.

The second point is that actually having the continuous legislative -- authority for continuous legislative session can be very disastrous from the State's standpoint, as witness what happened during Governor Boggs' administration in Delaware. I was up in Delaware quite a bit during that time, and up there, the Legislature does meet all the time, and they did meet all the time.
