2 terminating as provided by law. I don't think that in  
3 the separation of powers concept, and I think this goes  
4 pretty far back in constitutional history, the Chief  
5 Executive should have anything to say about when the Legis-  
6 lature meets or adjourns. Vernon Eney reminded me after  
7 my last meeting, this was thought by those in England  
8 many years ago. I don't think the Chief Executive should  
9 have anything to say about when the Legislature is in  
10 session.

11 DR. BARD: You would not have them call a  
12 special session under this concept?

13 JUDGE ADKINS: Yes, I would have him call a  
14 special session, but I would not have it provided by  
15 statute when they would meet. That is what you envisage in  
16 this.

17 MR. MARTINEAU: What does the governor have to  
18 do other than veto the bill?

19 JUDGE ADKINS: That is it precisely.
