enough, because I have been acting around the Legislature now for the past fifteen or sixteen years. probably 90 days would be appropriate. I feel, too, if you are going to have a cutoff period, that maybe the Constitution should provide that if the work is not completed, that the governor would have the right to issue an order for a continuing operation of the present General Assembly for a period of, say, not more than ten days, to clear up the work that is in the General Assembly as part of that regular session. If, for instance, they have a cutoff date and then the governor wants to call a special session again, everything introduced has to be a new bill. I can recall a couple of years ago when the courts ruled that they couldn't set the clock back any more. They passed some legislation after the 12 o'clock deadline, and they had to reintroduce about eight bills that already/been passed to make sure they were constitutionally right. I think this is just nonsense.
