I think if they could have had an extension of time that
these bills could have been acted on in the procedure,
and they would have been taken care of and become law. I

feel that probably 90 days, if you are going to use a
cutoff date, would be more appropriate. I think you
should have a proviso to extend it a few days after that by

MR. CASE: The court didn't rule that. We mere afraid it would.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mrs. Bothe?

MRS. BOTHE: I am a little confused after reading the Kentucky provisions that Dr. Bard referred to because there they say the General Assembly shall be a continuing body, but then they go on to state how many days it may stay in session and provide that it could be extended for another 30, on vote, but they are circumscribed. They can't meet all year round, and yet they can be a continuing body. I think we have got two different concepts here that are being confused in the debate. One is whether the General Assembly shall be continuing or a continuous body, in which event bills would
