MR. MARTINEAU: I would just like to apply what Judge Adkins said this morning about the fixing the ten per cent figure for redistricting to this question. It seems to me that we are entering into an era where we may have a unicameral Legislature for all we know. We are going to have a completely different sort of Legislature, both in makeup and in what they are going to be considering and I certainly don't feel that I am qualified to sit here in what Judge Adkins referred to as our ivory tower and decide how long the Legislature should or should not sit in session and write it into a constitution. For that reason, it seems to me it would be most ill-advised to write into this section any specific time limitations.

MR. SCANLAN: I join in Mr. Martineau's sentiments. I am willing to trust their responsibility. I see all arguments for having a date certain. People have to adjust their affairs. I surmise if we pass this General Assembly acting under it would probably come up with a statute which would contain reasonable restrictions against dragging the legislative process throughout the whole year, but I trust their judgment in this matter.
