THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Melvin?

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MR. MELVIN: I would like to speak against the idea of continuing sessions. I am not talking about the period of time now but just the continuing nature of the Legislature.

THE CHAIRMAN: Let me make it clear once again that the Committee is not considering continuing session, continuing body.

MR. MELVIN: I understand, Mr. Savre has

mentioned the alleged difficulties of the staff and all that sort of thing. My experience has been that that is not the difficulty. I see no advantage to having continuing, or having it a continuing body, and I am particularly opposed to the idea of allowing bills which have failed to be regarded, to be picked up where they are left off. I think that would be very chaotic. As somebody mentioned here, you had close to 2000 bills introduced, and I think only about a third of those actually passed. If every time they came back in you had to go and pick up with those other two-thirds, I think the paper

work would be prohibitive of ever getting anything done.
