is actually only a small fraction of the total number of copies that are issued. This includes copies that we are required to send by virtue of joint resolutions of the Legislature, copies that we are sending to various cooperating organizations such as the State Bar Association Committee on the Constitution, City Bar Association Committee on the Constitution, League of Women Voters, Democratic clubs, Legislative Liaison Committee and numerous other groups.

Accordingly, when a report comes in, it has been found necessary in order to put it through to reproduce at one time the total number of copies required and not merely reproduce what is required for the Commission and its staff. This means that it takes a very long time to process the reports, get them typed, checked, and get them through the office and then have them mailed out. With the limited staff we have, it has completely bogged down in the past few weeks with the result that the reports on the agenda for today have not been in your hands for a week prior to this meeting.

This poses some problems for this meeting but
