the Judiciary Department report to come up after that, but Mr. Case learned suddenly the other day that he must be in Baltimore tomorrow and therefore the first report of the Committee on Finance and Taxation will follow that.

I think that's about all we will be able to get through today. That will carry us through both the afternoon and evening sessions.

Tomorrow we will take up the report of the Committee on the Judiciary Department and the report of the, part of the report of the Committee on Miscellaneous Provisions.

If we have time, we will also discuss, although not act upon a preliminary tentative draft report of the Committee on Miscellaneous Provisions.

I am sure all of you have looked at the size of each report and have wondered how we can possibly get through them in the four sessions scheduled. I think we can but it means we necessarily will have to observe strictly some ground rules. Number one ground rule is that which we must observe in order to get a record of
