I suggest that at this time we not try to make a great many changes of style or any which lead to protracted discussion. I am more interested in getting before the Commission and before the public a complete text of a tentative draft of the Constitution than I am in having one that is the final polished document.

I will not know until the end of the session tomorrow, when we take the question up with the Committee, what your pleasure will be as to the next meeting, whether you will want to postpone it a week because this meeting is postponed a week, whether it will be a two-day session, if so, what two days, or even a longer session. I do not see how we can possibly hope to have less than a two-day meeting in September. It is perhaps the key meeting of all.

This means that we will also begin serious work on what we have been calling the work book, the supplemental report that will contain the documentation for the draft which we will be submitting. In this area we need a tremendous amount of help. The original idea of developing this with research assistants has been
