helpful but it is simply not enough. I think perhaps the most urgent problem is to try to get someone who could be available to us full time and act as sort of editor of the project, pull it together and boil down the various documents that we have and bring them together in some coherent form.

I went to New York several weeks ago and discussed the problems with the representatives of the National Municipal League, who are watching our progress with a great deal of interest and received several suggestions from them.

I find, however, that just as our experience has been, that to put your hands on qualified personnel is very, very difficult, this has been the experience of every other state trying to operate a Constitutional Convention or a preparation Commission. There is simply and earth of persons who are qualified, who have the necessary writing and editorial skill plus the knowledge of the Constitutional revision that is desirable in order to do the task. However, we have gotten several names and I am hoping that we will be able to work out that
