comments we will be asked to vote upon tomorrow. I didn't know where to start reading yesterday. I skimmed it. If we go as we did last time, we will meet late tonight. I wonder if there is any way we could have time so those of us who have not had a chance to become familiar with this report could at least do some homework or in some way make ourselves ready for the vote. I imagine there are others in the same position.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Bond, we are, of course, fully aware of this. I intended to say that we would not regard the action of the Commission on any of the reports that are being presented for the first time today as necessarily being final. We had hoped to present the preliminary draft of the article on the Judiciary at the last meeting. The preliminary draft was circulated a month ago. So that while this is in one sense the first time this is being considered, nevertheless the substance of it, certainly 90 per cent of it, has been in the hands of the Commission members for a month.

Nevertheless I would not consider that the action of the Commission in approving the language of the report is
