I might preface the remarks very quickly by pointing out this is the third or fourth go-round on the election article. There is nothing new in this report, nothing of substance which is new. The changes which are recommended here reflect the suggestions made by the Commission in Easton and hopefully at least the Committee is hopeful this would be the final report. For the reason that the Committee strongly feels that any further changes one way or the other as we have been doing in the past are going to destroy the over-all pattern and over-all continuity of the article.

Moving in now to what is Section 4, Section 4 as presented previously left the question, some question in the minds of the Commission, as to whether or not the mental incompetency as a disqualification for voting was sufficiently clear. So it was suggested there and the Committee now recommends that the General Assembly is to establish disqualifications for voting for the reasons of mental incompetence and conviction of serious crime. This would leave to the General Assembly the question of whether it is an incompetence by reason
