

1 MR. CASE: I would say without getting into
2 a lengthy debate on that because it can be debated,
3 you can find cases in the Court of Appeals calling, for
4 example, Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission a
5 political subdivision, that the matter be rereferred
6 to the Committee with the idea of selecting the
7 appropriate term to designate what we are talking about,
8 namely, resort towns and this kind of thing. I would
9 so move if it is in order.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Clagett.)

11 MR. CLAGETT: I would make this comment.
12 The Committee on Political Subdivisions and local
13 government is going to recommend that the broad grant
14 of powers be given to the counties. It is contemplated
15 that the counties would within a broad grant determine
16 the election qualifications.

17 By putting this in the Constitution as it
18 stands now, you are really to some extent restricting
19 the Legislature from coming into the picture and
20 regulating uniformly for all counties throughout the
21 state where it may be desirable to do so in order to
