but they wouldn't technically have title to real estate.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry, do you want to comment?

MR. GENTRY: I don't think that was given special consideration.

PROFESSOR: ASPER: It was, based on my recollection of the discussion, it was all, the only things actually discussed were Ocean City and Bel Air on real property, people who comed homes, summer homes, this sort of thing.

THE CHAIRMAN: Was it that or was it the intent to permit the municipality to extend the right to vote to taxpayers?

PROFESSOR ASPER: I understood that it was owners of real property subject, as Mr. Case suggested, to sewerage assessments and that sort of thing.

MR. MARTINEAU: I believe the phrase, from the abbreviated version of the minutes I have, I believeMr. Miles used it, he said property owner, but did not designate real or personal property.
