DR. JENKINS: When this issue first arose, I stated that my heart was with unicameralism but my head was with bicameralism. I feel that with the one man, one vote principle that the whole logic of the situation is with unicameralism, but I felt it was not politically feasible.

After the consultation with the Legislative Committee, however, I feel that this is politically feasible. This Commission, of course, will not have the final say on the matter. If we were to vote for a unicameral legislature, it would present the issue to the constitutional convention and would have the merit then of giving the electorate and the members of the constitutional convention a good period of time to debate the issues and to bring to the people an understanding of what unicameralism is.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Gentry.

MR. GENTRY: I would favor the unicameral system for this reason. That while the bicameral system has meaning on the Federal level because of the difference in make-up and representation and election of personnel
