All those in favor signify by saying aye, contrary, no. The aves have it, so ordered.

MR. GENTRY: Moving down to those sections of the article relating to referendum, in Section 8, which describes the referendum and filing of it, signatures, et cetera, we have changed. The fact that emergency law should now read three-fifths vote because we might not have an emergency law definition picked up elsewhere.

We took out the reference to file with the Secretary of State, left that blank.

That is the only change. Other than that Section 8 reads as submitted at Easton. In other words, there has been no change of substance but just changed words to mean hopefully the same thing. Threefifths vote of all members of each house be equated with an emergency law.

PROFESSOR ASPER: It is more comprehensive than an emergency law. As I understand it, it was the wish of the Commission that this apply to any law passed by a three-fifths majority of members of both houses
