> THE CHAIRMAN: That is right.

MR. CASE: That is correct. This is the compromise suggestion made at Easton to embrace that and properly so.

THE CHAIRMAN: Any questions?

JUDGE ADKINS: I have a question on the validity of this concept. I am not clear in my mind whether I am right or wrong. It seems to me if a bill is labeled an emergency bill and passes by a three-fifths majority that the members voting on the bill are conscious that it is an emergency bill and hence cast their vote with that fact before them. And at the same time they can be conscious or subconsciously aware of the fact that the bill cannot be suspended by a petition.

If you simply require that any bill passed by a three-fifths vote will not be suspended, it seems to me then you leave yourself open to the point of view of not having the Legislature aware at the time it votes on the bill that this can be operative. I am not stating
