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I think it wouldn't take long for the Legislature to
get used to the new language. I would prefer the
language as it stands even though Mr. Case didn't
intend it that way.

MR. CASE: We talked about it in the context of emergency legislation but seeing it in print I think this is preferable.

clear recollection of the matter, I do regard this
language is certainly as I intended it. I felt with
some stress I was defending the referendum rather vigorously

I thought this clearly preserved the referendum on matters of close votes in the Legislature with some exceptions which we have written in but that when the

but not wanting to defend the abuses of the referendum

Legislature had a pretty strong preponderance that we did not have a referendum.
