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need an arbitrary guide line in this situation to know exactly when things are going to happen.

THE CHAIRMAN: Mr. Sayre's point is a bill might provide that its effective date be postponed for a year, January 1, 1968, and if it were submitted to referendum and approved, you might advance the date by this language. Is that your point, Mr. Sayre?

MR. SAYRE: Yes, exactly.

MR. MARTINEAU: I have a question here. Is it contemplated that the Legislature will not be able to pass a bill that is to go into effect immediately?

MR. GENTRY: I don't follow you.

MR. MARTINEAU: Is it contemplated the Legislature will be able to pass a bill that will go into effect immediately?

MR. SAYRE: Yes, and if it is the case, we should allow for that.

MR. MARTINEAU: If that is the case, the way this reads, you have to file a petition before the date on which any law enacted by the General Assembly is to go into effect. So it doesn't provide for the
