I think that is it, isn't it?

MR. GENTRY: Section 9 does involve a recommendation of the Committee which varies from what was decided at the Easton meeting.

We passed before in voting, the percentage voting, we had no reference to spread of vote throughout the state. We were told at Easton if this was desirable, generally we picked up the language which is in the brackets there which would effect that.

What I would point out is that the Committee in drafting this deliberated pros and cons of referendum, went into the various things, we were content to stick with the 5 per cent although there was some reluctance to consider that. We did not like at all the bracketed material which would require that the referendum vote be spread, be given some spread throughout the state.

Of course, there is still some sentiment in the Committee for deletion of the referendum entirely but
