it was felt unanimously if we are to have referendum it should be susceptible of use by the electorate.

To tie in this bracketed language we feel it loses all meaning and the Committee felt that this is the language which would do the trick but we recommended it not be included.

THE CHAIRMAN: Since this is a matter that was considered at the last meeting but is now asked by the Committee to be reconsidered, it will be submitted. I ask you to make your comments as briefly as possible. I think that the members of the Committee should be given the right to comment first. Professor Asper, do you want to add anything to what Mr. Gentry said about that?

PROFESSOR ASPER: No, except we were given a general directive at Easton to put in a provision insuring that it was a matter of interest to a substantial part of the state. This provision which seems to do that is something I adapted from the present Nebraska Constitution which requires in effect the 5 per cent be accomplished in approximately two-fifths of the
